2. APPLICATION PROCESS

Step 1 - Complete the Expression of Interest (EOI) form

The Expression of Interest form makes up part of this pack, which also includes an Admission Statement. In the Admission Statement you will answer key questions about your career aspirations and motivations for joining the program.

Once the form has been completed, send your form to one of the following emails:

EOI submissions deadline is 11 April 2025.

Step 2 - Interview with CET

At the discretion of the Training Managers, you may be required to attend an interview at one of our CET campuses.

Step 3 - CET will arrange your Readiness Assessment (RA)

Following the submission of your EOI, you will be invited to complete a Readiness Assessment (RA) on-site at one of our campuses. The RA evaluates literacy, numeracy, and problem-solving skills that are required in the electrical industry.



Assessments will be conducted between 21-25 April 2025.

3. SELECTION PROCESS

As this high-demand course has a very limited number of available spaces, CET are committed to selecting students who will benefit most from the program and have a genuine interest in pursuing an electrical career.

Applications will be assessed based on the following criteria:

- ✓ Your Readiness Assessment results
- ✓ Your Admission Statement (part of your EOI form)
- ✓ Interview performance (if an interview is required)

While a strong performance in the Readiness Assessment is highly valued, CET also take into account your interview performance and your Admission Statement when making their decision on which students will be offered a place in the program.

Selection outcome timeline

Successful applicants will receive a letter of offer from CET no later than 16 May 2025.

The course will run from 16 June 2025.







4. PRE-APPRENTICESHIP TRAINING LICENCES

To participate in work placement, you must obtain a Pre-Apprenticeship Training Licence. This Licence will be organised on the first day of your Pre-Apprenticeship at CET. No action is required until this time.

- Cost: \$88.00
- Complete questionnaire and form R117 on Induction Day
- A copy of the licence must be provided to CET prior to any work placement

5. WORK PLACEMENTS

-  Minimum of 150 hours required, and logged in the CET logbook (provided by CET prior to placement commencing).
-  Work placements must be carried out with a business holding an EC licence number.
-  Students must always work under the supervision of a fully qualified electrician (EW number required).
-  CET will conduct two site visits.
